CLASS 1. FRUIT CAKE

8 oz. S.R. Flour

1/2 teaspoon Mixed Spice
1/4 teaspoon Salt
6 oz. Margarine or Butter
6 oz. Caster Sugar
3 Eggs
1 tablespoon Milk

15 oz. Dried Mixed Fruit
Grated rind of small Orange

- Cream margarine and sugar, gradually add lightly beaten eggs.
- Fold in flour, salt and spice, add mixed fruit and orange rind.
- 3. Place in a deep 8" cake tin.
- 4. Bake in centre of a moderate oven (325—350° F., gas mark 3—4) for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours approx.

CLASS 2. VICTORIA SANDWICH

4 ozs. Margarine

4 ozs. S.R. Flour

4 ozs. Caster Sugar

2 Eggs

- Cream margarine and sugar until light and creamy in texture.
- 2. Add egg a little at a time and beat well. Gently fold-in flour.
- Place mixture into a greased 7" cake tin or two 7" sandwich tins.
- 4. Bake in moderate oven (325—350° F., gas mark 3—4).
