Section A

CLASS 1. FRUIT CAKE

8 oz. S.R. Flour
 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon Mixed Spice
 $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon Salt
6 oz. Margarine or Butter
6 oz. Caster Sugar
3 Eggs (*large - enough moisture*)
1 tablespoon Milk (*used or not*)
15 oz. Dried Mixed Fruit
Grated rind of small Orange

1. Cream margarine and sugar, gradually add lightly beaten eggs.
 2. Fold in flour, salt and spice, add mixed fruit and orange rind.
 3. Place in a deep 8" cake tin.
 4. Bake in centre of a moderate oven (325—350° F., gas mark 3—4) for 1½ hours approx.

CLASS 2. VICTORIA SANDWICH

4 ozs. Margarine 4 ozs. S.R. Flour
4 ozs. Caster Sugar 2 Eggs

1. Cream margarine and sugar until light and creamy in texture.
 2. Add egg a little at a time and beat well. Gently fold-in flour.
 3. Place mixture into a greased 7" cake tin or two 7" sandwich tins.
 4. Bake in moderate oven (325—350° F., gas mark 3—4).
25—30 minutes in two tins.
40—45 minutes in one tin.
 5. When cool, split and fill with jam or cream.
