Section A

CLASS 1. FRUIT CAKE

8 oz. S.R. Flour

1 teaspoon Mixed Spice

teaspoon Salt

6 oz. Margarine or Butter

6 oz. Caster Sugar

3 Eggs

1 tablespoon Milk, if required

12 oz. Dried Mixed Fruit

- 1. Cream margarine and sugar, gradually add lightly beaten eggs.
- 2. Fold in flour, salt and spice, add mixed fruit.
- 3. Place in a deep 8" cake tin.
- Bake in centre of a moderate oven (325—350° F., gas mark 3—4) for 1½ hours approx.

CLASS 2. VICTORIA SANDWICH

4 ozs. Margarine

4 ozs. S.R. Flour

4 ozs. Caster Sugar

2 Eggs

- 1. Cream margarine and sugar until light and creamy in texture.
- 2. Add egg a little at a time and beat well. Gently fold-in flour.
- Place mixture into a greased 7" cake tin or two 7" sandwich tins.
- 4. Bake in moderate oven (325—350° F., gas mark 3—4). 25—30 minutes in two tins.

40—45 minutes in one tin.

5. When cool, split and fill with jam or cream.
