

RECIPE SHEET

Section A

CLASS 1. APPLE TART ON A PLATE

Shortcrust pastry top and bottom, apples in between. Any size plate, no decoration, i.e. leaves.

Finish, brush with egg white or cold water and sprinkle with caster sugar.

CLASS 2. VICTORIA SANDWICH

4 ozs. Margarine

4 ozs. S. R. Flour

4 ozs. Caster Sugar

2 Eggs

- 1. Cream margarine and sugar until light and creamy in texture.
- 2. Add egg a little at a time and beat well. Gently fold-in flour.
- 3. Place mixture into a greased 7" cake tin or two 7" sandwich tins.
- 4. Bake in moderate oven (325 350 F., Gas mark 3-4)

25 - 30 minutes in two tins.

40 - 45 minutes in one tin.

5. When cool, split and fill with jam or cream.


