Section A.

CLASS 1. APPLE TART ON A PLATE
Shortcrust pastry top and bottom, apples in between.
Any size plate, no decoration ie leaves.
Finish, brush with egg white or cold water and sprinkle with caster sugar.

CLASS 2. VICTORIA SANDWICH

4oz Margarine4oz SR Flour4oz Caster Sugar2 Eggs

- 1. Cream margarine and sugar until light and creamy in texture.
- 2. Add egg little at a time and beat well. Gently fold in flour.
- 3. Place mixture into a greased 7" cake tin or two 7" sandwich tins
- 4. Bake in a moderate oven (325-350°F, Gas mark 3-4) 25-30 minutes in two tins 40-45 minutes in one tin.
- 5. When cool, split and fill with jam or cream.

- 5. Exhibits must be brought to Elsworth School between 7.00pm and 9.00pm on Friday 3rd September or between 8.00am and 10.00am on Saturday 4th September.
- 6. Exhibits must not be removed before 4.00pm on the day of the show. The Committee will be very grateful for any exhibits left for auction after 4.30pm.
- 7. Exhibitors may make more than one entry in any one class. Each exhibit must be accompanied by an entry form and appropriate fee.
- 8. Exhibitors must provide own plates, vases etc. as they require. The Committee will not be responsible for any breakage or loss of such items.
- 9. Each class may be judged 1st, 2nd 3rd. Prizes awarded:

FIRST 50p SECOND 30p THIRD 20p

Certificates will be awarded to those achieving a First in each childrens class.

- 10. Where the entries are less than four in any one class, the awarding of more than one prize will be at the discretion of the judge.
