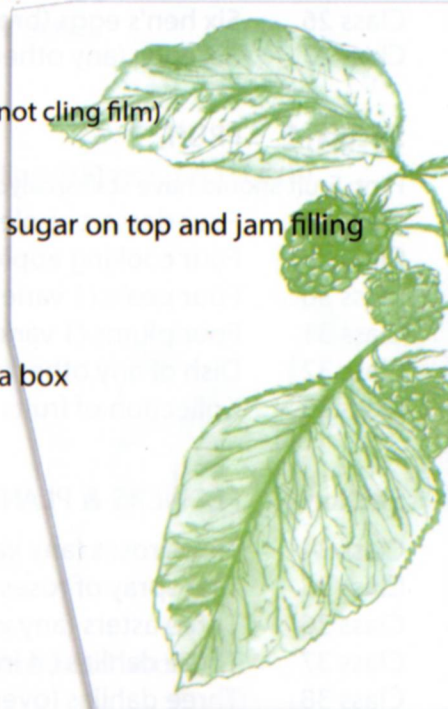

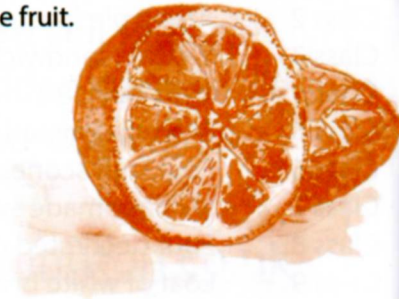

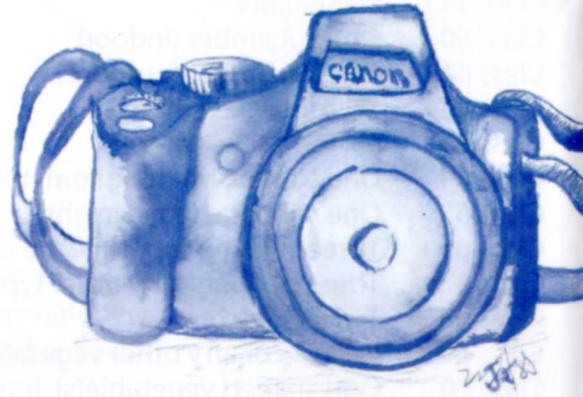

2. Everything entered must be grown or made by the Exhibitor except flowers used in floral arrangements.
3. Entries 30p. Entries by Children aged 16 years and under are free in Section M only.
4. How to Enter
 - i. In person with entry form at the Poacher on Friday 1st September between 6-8pm or bring to the school on Saturday 2nd September between 2-4pm
 - ii. Drop off entry form at Peter Gladders, 8 Smith Street, Elsworth (by noon of Friday before show. Include any entry fees in your envelope please).
 - iii. Email entries to sarah@highbarns.co.uk by 4pm on Saturday 2nd September

NO ENTRY FORMS WILL BE ACCEPTED ON SUNDAY MORNING
5. Exhibits may be left for staging by the stewards on Saturday 2nd September between 2.00pm and 4.00pm OR by the exhibitor between 8.00am and 9.45am on Sunday 3rd September
6. Exhibits must not be removed before 4.00pm on the day of the show. The Committee will be very grateful for any exhibits left for auction at 4.30pm.
7. Exhibitors may make more than one entry in any one class. Each exhibit must be accompanied by an entry form and appropriate fee.
8. Exhibitors must provide own plates, vases etc. as they require. The Committee will not be responsible for any breakage or loss of such items.
9. Each class may be judged 1st, 2nd 3rd. Prizes awarded:

SECOND	£1.00
THIRD	50p
10. Where the entries are less than four in any one class, the awarding of more than one prize will be at the discretion of the judge.
11. In case of any dispute the Committee's decision will be final.
